Habitat making announcement about Main St. build

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As part of the celebration this weekend at the Strawberry Festival, Habitat for Humanity GTA is set to make a major announcement about the construction of their first home in Whitchurch-Stouffville.

In January, Habitat for Humanity GTA regional vice president Richard Solomon delivered a presentation to town council regarding the details of an upcoming home.

Construction was planned for April/May with occupancy expected four months after, Solomon told council in January. The first home was to be built on 6554 Main St., at the corner of Stouffer Street and Main.

The announcement, set for Saturday, July 2, will be made alongside Mayor Justin Altmann.

The raised bungalow will be occupied by a family of four from Richmond Hill who currently live in crowded and rundown housing.

"They are thrilled to be moving into Stouffville and looking forward to being proud homeowners," Solomon told councillors in January.

Habitat for Humanity GTA will make the announcement at their booth, No. 564, on the east side of Park Drive at 1:30 p.m. on Saturday.

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

York Region has initiated a Schedule 'B' Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment to better understand if the existing water supply and storage capacity in the Ballantrae-Musselman Lake area will meet the long-term water needs of the community.

In addition, the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville Official Plan Amendment No. 136 is currently under review for approval with The Regional Municipality of York (York Region), Servicing future population growth in the Ballantrae-Musselman Lake area contemplated by Amendment No. 136, may require an increase in water supply and storage capacity.

The Study Area and Municipal Water Service Area for this project are shown to the right:

Consultation with and input from the public and government review agencies will be a key component of the Class EA study. Public Consultation Centres (PCCs) will be scheduled this fall to provide further details, answer questions regarding the project and provide an opportunity for residents to provide feedback.
