## Group protests OSPCA euthanization order for 21 dogs

he cold temperatures and bitter wind didn't stop a BSL Awareness group from protesting in front of the head office of the Ontario Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (OSPCA) on the border of Newmarket and Whitchurch-Stouffville Saturday.

Their action was a response to what the group considers unfair treatment of dogs under breed specific legislation (BSL), specifically the OSPCA euthanization order for 21 dogs seized in Chatham-Kent last year from an alleged dog-fighting ring.

The protestors strongly believe there are other options available for the dogs of various pit bull breeds.

In a press release issued Feb. 17, the OSPCA stated that "euthanasia of any animal is always a last resort. It is a decision made after consultation with experts and after all options for the health and safety of the public and of the animals have been exhausted."
