Despite her new responsibilities at Church of the Good Shepherd, Eugenie will continue to serve as a co-director of the weekly Share the Music program at Wesley. She will also assist with the Christmas pageant at St. Mark.

In addition to organ and piano, Eugenie is an accomplished guitarist. She's also utilized her vocal talent at countless weddings and funerals.

No conversation with Eugenie is complete without involving daughter Kiana, the love of her life. A Grade 9 student enrolled in

Trips, covering millions of miles, have taken him across Canada many times as well as areas of Northern


"It's been a long ride," he says.
