New Gormley GO station offers 10 train trips per day

Gormley is getting a new GO station, announced Thursday, Nov. 24 in Richmond Hill. From Dec. 5, the station will offer five morning and five afternoon train trips serving the Richmond Hill line. The station is just west of Hwy. 404 and Stouffville Road.

GO buses will also serve the station, providing two-way midday service between Gormley and Union Station. Nighttime service from Union Station will also be provided.

There are 850 parking spaces, electric vehicle charging stations, a bus loop, a kiss-andride area, heated shelters and a platform snowmelt system.

The station opening is part

of Ontario's public infrastructure investment. Approximately \$160 billion is being invested over 12 years to support 110,000 jobs, the province stated in a press release.

Oak Ridges-Markham MPP Helena Jaczek and Richmond

Hill MPP Reza Moridi, along with Richmond Hill Regional Councillor Brenda Hogg and Ward 1 Councillor Greg Beros, were present for the ribboncutting ceremony on Thursday.

The province invested \$22 million for the construction of

the new Gormley station. It is the third GO station built since 2013.

Gormley GO Station has been built to achieve the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Silver certification.
