Mathias Gold (Kevin Kline) is a down-on-his-luck New Yorker who inherits a Parisian apartment from his estranged father. But when he arrives to sell it, he's shocked to discover a tenant, Mathilde Girard (Maggie Smith) who has lived in the apartment with her daughter Chloé (Kristin Scott Thomas) for many years, and has no intention of leaving.

"Having Maggie Smith on screen is like biting into a crisp, slightly sour apple," writes Times UK critic Kate Muir. "Even when she is playing a woman in her nineties, quilted with wrinkles, the interior is deliciously tart."

On Thursday, Jan. 22 at 7 p.m. Starlight Cinema presents *Pride*, featuring a stellar cast which includes Imelda Staunton, Bill Nighy and Paddy Considine. Funny, poignant and deeply moving, the movie is based on events that took place during the British miners' strike of 1984 when Margaret Thatcher was Prime Minister.

A London-based group of gay and lesbian activists decides to raise money to support strikers' families. Initially rebuffed by the union, the group identifies a tiny mining village in Wales and sets off to make their donation in person. As the strike drags on, the two groups discover that standing

together makes for the strongest union of all.

"Barriers tumble and pride is upheld as the tapestry of emotions is woven together when gay and lesbian activists become staunch supporters of striking miners," writes Louise Keller of Urban Cinefile. "The heart of *Billy Elliott* and the conviction of *Milk*."

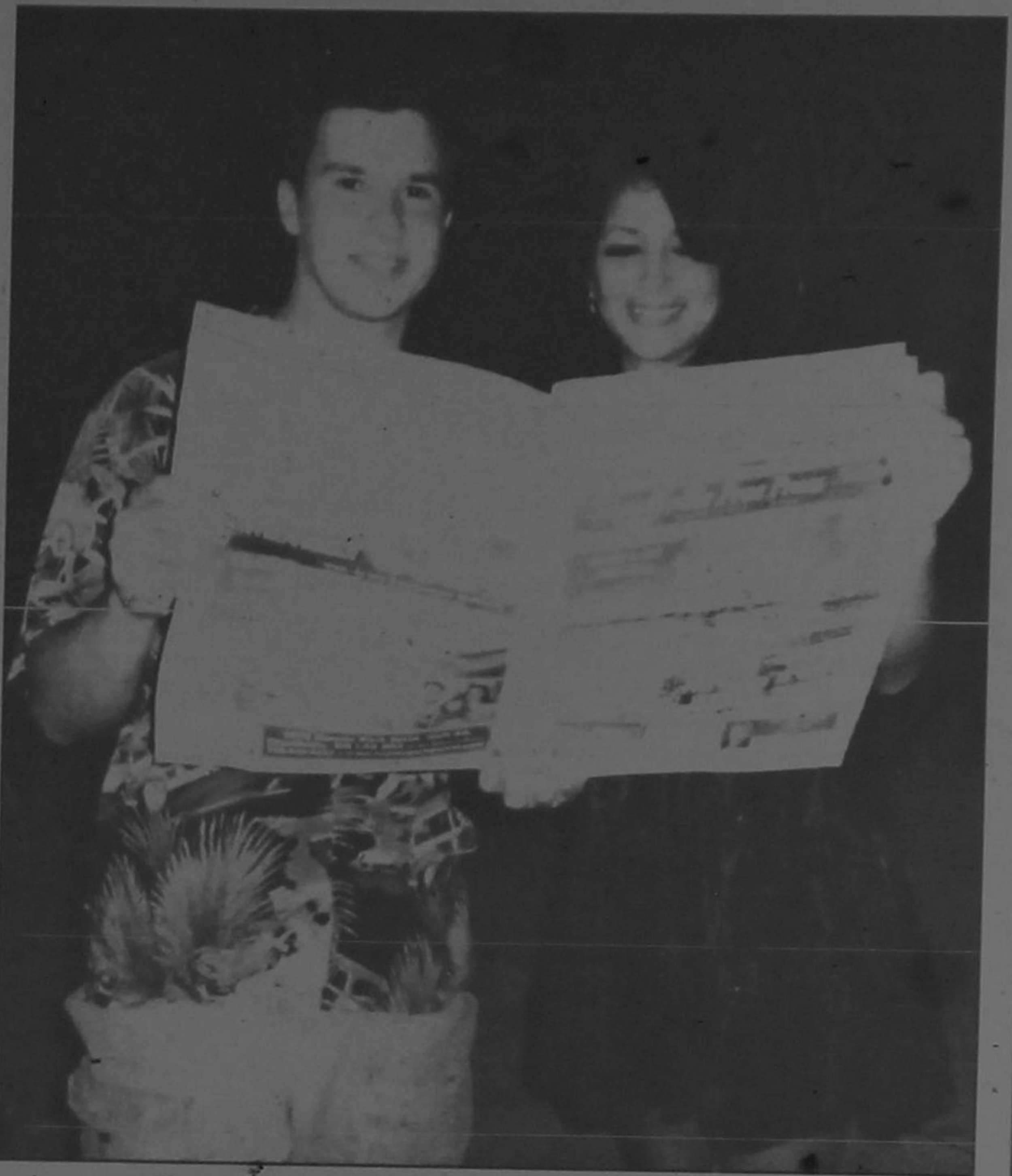
Ellington's bands.
