On Wednesday, Feb. 11 at 7 p.m. Starlight Cinema at Nineteen on the Park presents *Keep on Keepin' On*, the remarkable story of 93-year-old jazz legend Clark Terry.

A living monument to the Golden Era of Jazz, Terry - a mentor to Miles Davis - is among the few performers ever to have played in both Count Basie's and Duke Ellington's bands.

"*Keep on Keepin' On* might document the passing of a musical torch from one century to the next, but for one sticking point: The first torch plan refuses to go out," writes Ty Burr in the Boston Globe.

On Tuesday Feb. 17 at 7 p.m. Starlight Cinema presents *Land Ho!* the story of two ex-brothers-in-law who head off for Iceland in an attempt to reclaim their youth at Reykjavik nightclubs, trendy spas and rugged campsites. This comedic and rowdy adventure offers a candid exploration of aging, loneliness and friendship.

Tom Long of the Detroit News writes, "*Land Ho!* is an indie oddball of a movie that wanders about with two seniors looking to squeeze a bit more out of life. The squeezing is gentle but affirming, just like the film."

On Wednesday, Feb. 25, Starlight Cinema presents *Force Majeure* (Swedish with subtitles), chronicling a week in the life of a Swedish family staying at a luxury resort in the French Alps.

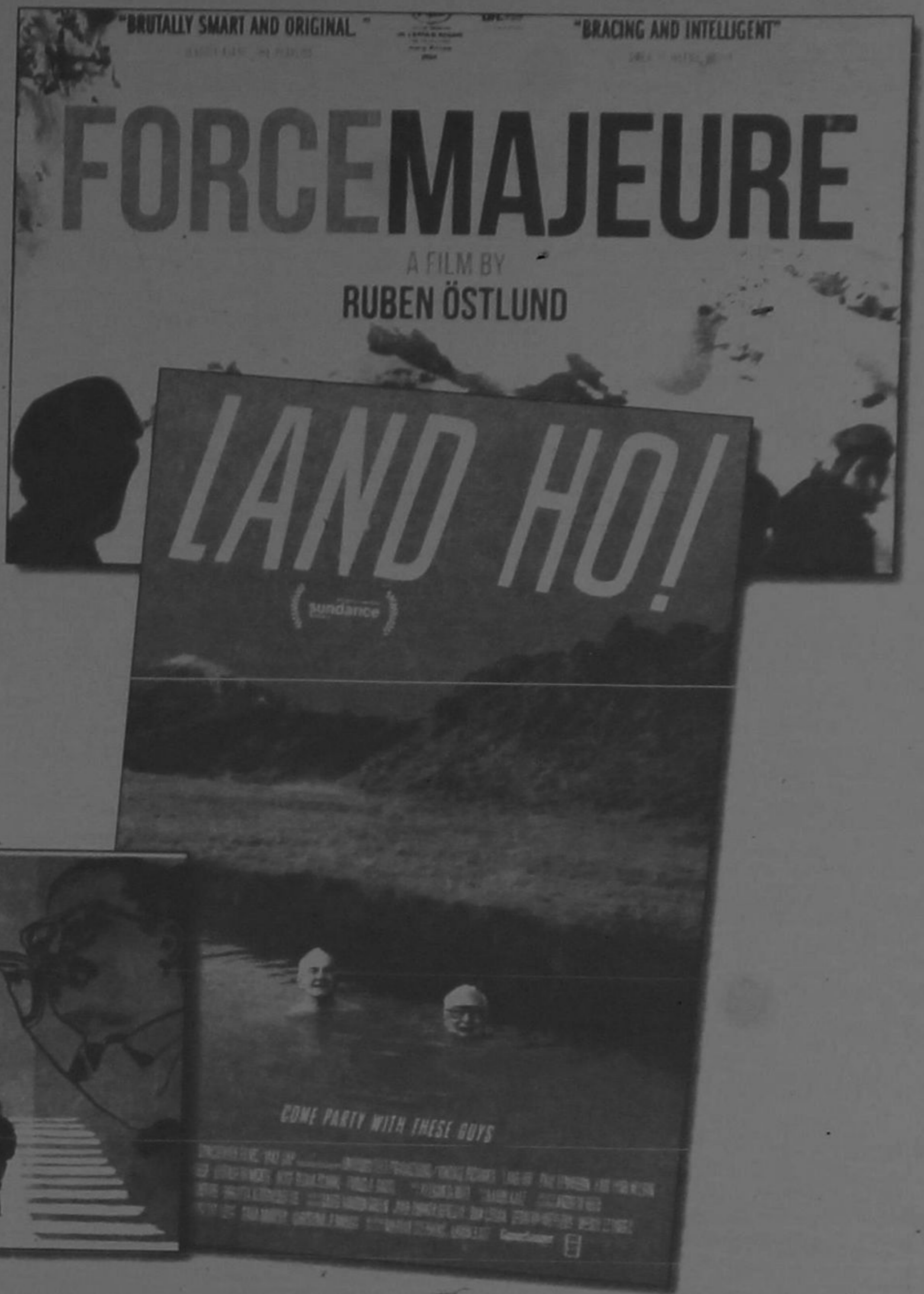
Tomas, his wife Ebba, and their two young children are on their second day at the resort when a controlled avalanche goes awry and threatens them as they are having

lunch. Tomas panics and runs, leaving Ebba with the children. He quickly returns and no one is hurt, but his momentary cowardice and refusal to admit what he did creates a rift in his marriage that he struggles to repair.

"*Force Majeure* is both funny and sad, often in the same glance-averted instant. See it with someone you'd trust to stick around in an avalanche. It's one of the highlights of 2014," writes Michael Phillips of the Chicago Tribune.
