Today the plant has become a veritable tree, boasting an astonishing 70 blooms at its peak. "It has so many different branches." it keeps my husband busy staking it. It

doesn't seem to be like the little orchids in the store," she said, with gentle understatement.

"It's been a wonderful anniversary present every year and I ask myself, how can something so beautiful come out of something so awful?" When she first received her diagnosis, she was shocked, because jaw cancer is usually related to smoking, " and I've never had a cigarette in my life.'




