Transportation Platform Plank

Stouffville is served by two transit providers, Metrolinx (Go Transit) and York Region Transit (YRT). If elected I would like to push for the following changes

York Region Transit

- . I would like to pursue YRT service levels as it relates to the Town and Ward 6. Firstly, Route 9 does not currently run on weekends. Residents need to have weekend service that connects them to a City of 300,000 (Markham).
- Secondly, Eastern Gate is not currently serviced by YRT. Residents have to walk a minimum of 800 meters to get to a transit stop. There has to be transit stop at Eastern Gate.
- . Thirdly, there needs to be YRT service down York Durham line and west along Hoover Park. This would bring connectivity to Loretta and Greendale neighbourhoods.
- And finally transit shelters need to be built at key transit stops for the protection of transit users against the weather.

Metrolinx (Go Transit)


- Currently Stouffville has six trains servicing the morning and evening commute to and from Toronto. I would encourage the Mayor and Council to press Metrolinx for weekend GO service and to add a later train for the morning and ·evening commutes.
- . If elected, I would like to see the formation of a Transit Committee made up of Town transit users that would meet quarterly with the Mayor and Council to review current service levels for both GO and YRT.
- . I would also set forth a motion with Council to approve the implementation of an adequate crosswalk in front of the Main Street GO station for the safety and convenience of the transit users.
- And finally transit shelters need to be built at key transit stops for the protection of transit users against the weather.

Seniors & Youth Platform Plank

. I strongly support the current plan to move the 55+ Club into the new expanded Lebovic Centre building. The new location will give the club the needed area for their expanding membership. The new facility will be over 12,000 square feet of very serviceable space. It will allow the members to be in the centre for recreational and social activities. The new Lebovic Centre will have a new expanded Library, gymnasium, fitness room and indoor pool.

. The town will be completing the new state of the art skate park in the spring. This facility will not only have a skate park but as well as new basketball courts. This facility was a team effort from the mayor and council through fundraising efforts.

. I would like to see a Youth Center in the downtown. The town owns a number of buildings throughout the community. If elected I would like to see the old Silver Jubilee club located at the corner of main-street and market street converted to a youth centre. This is a perfect location it is located in the downtown core. The center would be supervised by town staff and would allow for a place of interaction for the youth of the town. There could be study rooms made available along with a computer center to assist in job hunting and applications.
