Christmas dinner without Ms Carlson their knowledge, and "we surprised them at the door!", Ms. Carlson said. A friend or neighbour had put their name on the list.


The Christmas Day dinner was started by Stouffville Country Market owner Evangelical Norm Clements about to cook a turkey for delivery town-run event.
