Stouffville Recycling Group is launching a Let's Untrash the Place campaign, announced group president Jim Priebe recently. "The purpose is to find as many ways as possible to reduce garbage going to landfill."

The campaign will begin with a push for aluminum pop tabs. "Take them to the recycling depot, or any other place that collects them." Local businesses will be approached to assist in collecting the tabs, he said, while cans themselves should be recycled in the usual way.

Among suggestions for cutting back on unnecessary waste are taking used printer cartridges to the depot or the library, buying a backyard composter for kitchen waste, recycling plastic shopping bags -- some grocery stores provide a receptacle for the purpose -- or better still, shopping with reusable

bags. Mr. Priebe also suggests using refillable mugs at the coffee shop, repairing appliances and electronics instead of replacing them and buying quality toys and items which can be passed along instead of thrown away.

Local consignment stores buy and sell good quality, second-hand clothing, while the Care and Share Thrift Shop welcomes donations of clothing and household goods for re-sale. The store also offers some great bargains for buyers on a budget.


"Keep the preaddressed envelopes that
numerous organizations
send you, put on a label
and reuse them. Also,
before putting paper into
the recycling bin, check to
see whether it is single
sided." The other side can
be used for shopping lists
or notes, he said.

"Start a trend -- tell your friends you like your presents wrapped in reused paper and consider using services such as Canada Post's e-post to receive your bills electron-

ically." Some items must be taken to a hazardous waste depot for disposal. "People may be surprised to learn that they must not put batteries or old paint cans into their garbage" said Mr. Priebe.

A number of initiatives are planned for the coming year, he said. "We're very interested in trying to find a way to get old appliances, which would otherwise go to landfill, repaired and given to people in need. We're also interested in refurbishing discarded furniture for the same reason; however, our group doesn't have the expertise, so we're hoping people will come forward who have some familiarity with such programs."

The group is also planning to hold a town-wide garage sale, "but in order for us to keep organizing, we need to hear from citizens that they support this campaign." For more information, visit the Town's website, call 905-640-8294 or send an e-mail to recycle@enoreo.on.ca.
