Whitchurch-Stouffville Museum is hosting a three-day morning program for 8 to 14-year-olds which includes heritage crafts and cooking activities. The program runs March 17 to 19 from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. and the cost is

Each two-hour workshop is \$10 and pre-registration is required.

Don't Bug Me, I'm Reading is the theme for this year's March Break program at the library. Events include a magic show, bug crafts, musical workshops and lots of fun with Jelly Belly the clown. Parade of Wings, a costume contest, rounds out the fun on March 20. Individual presentations are \$2, or you can pick up a passport which covers all events for just \$7.
