Champion skipping team shows Orchard Park students the ropes

The Leamington Acro-Ropers, ranked Canada's top rope skipping team for 2002, recently performed for students at Orchard Park Public School.

"The team promotes a unique type of jumping called 'Nawatobi' which originated in Japan," explained Susan Kaunismaa, chair of public relations on the Orchard Park Council. "This distinct style of jumping is done on elevated four by eight foot panels of wood that enhance the success and accuracy of skills by providing an artificial lift."


After participating in international competition in Nepean, Ont., eight members the Leamington team were

selected to join Team Canada in 1994. "Their success in capturing their first world title in Ashiya, Japan has been followed by many competitions throughout the world in all styles of jumping rope -speed, power freestyle," said Kaunismaa.

"Orchard Park Skipping Team, which we believe is the only skipping team in existence in the GTA at the elementary level, was started four years ago by parent volunteer Nerine Jacobs. The team does performances for the Heart and Stroke Foundation to promote physical fitness to prevent heart disease (and) would also consider additional

opportunities to perform in and around the GTA area."
