## Some flowers are good enough to eat

The ancient Egyptians were one of the first civilizations to discover the secret of edible flowers. The Romans and Japanese also used petals in their recipes. Today, edible

blooms take second place to vegetables and climbing roses. Surprisingly, many of the foods we eat are actually derived from flowers: from cloves and saffron to broccoli, artichokes and rose water. Unfortunately, with the dawn of the refrigerator, a wider variety of foods suddenly became available year-round,

and edible flowers started losing their popularity. But today, blooms are reclaiming their place on our plates.

That doesn't mean all flowers are edible, however. Before taking a bite out of any bloom, be sure it's truly edible. Despite their attractive appearance and delicious scent, many flowers are actually quite toxic and can cause serious illnesses. Whether picking them yourself or buying them in a store, it's always best to select flowers that are specifically identified as edible.

The best time to pick edible blooms is in dry weather-at sunset or in the morning when the dew has evaporated. To best preserve their flavour and freshness, pick them just before serving. If you're growing your own edible flowers, avoid using pesticides or chemical fertilizers-unless you want to dine on poisonous substances.

A few edible flowers: Begonia, Nasturtium, Chrysanthemum, Stocks, Hosta, Daisy, Hollyhock, Marigold, SunflowerTulip and Violets

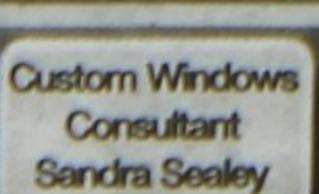
