The study showed "more than 45 per cent of Canadian women have no financial investments in their own name; more than half have no RRSP whatsoever, and close to 40 per cent admit they lack the confidence to manage their own investments."

Women do however on average have a longer life span and lower income than a man, and a 50 per cent divorce rate the article continues.

Karin Housely is a member of a group of 10 women who joined together to learn about investing. From her experience she tells readers "The most important thing a woman needs to do is change her attitude towards investing. 
