

# Reesor family celebrates bicentennial

Canada Day weekend, members of the Reesor family will gather at Markham Fairgrounds to celebrate the 200th anniversary of their ancestors' arrival in Canada.

In 1804, Christian Reesor and his wife, Fanny Reiff, left Pennsylvania and settled on Concession 10 in Markham Township. A hundred years later, their descendants hosted a family picnic on Christian Reesor's homestead at Locust Hill. Close to 1,500 family members attended and the reunion tradition was born.

The last reunion was held at Markham Fairgrounds in the summer of 2000, bringing together more than

2,300 cousins including Amos Reesor of Stouffville, who was the oldest male cousin in attendance.

This year's celebration includes the Reesor Homecoming on the evening of July 2, a full day of events and activities at Markham Fairgrounds July 3 and a settlers' church service on the banks of the Rouge River on July 4.

On the morning of July 3, a horse drawn wagon train will wend its way on an 11 km. trek from the Reesor Gates, adjacent to Christian Reesor's old homestead, to the fairgrounds, to commemorate the original six-week journey from Pennsylvania in five Conestoga wagons.
