Luke's spirit inspires family

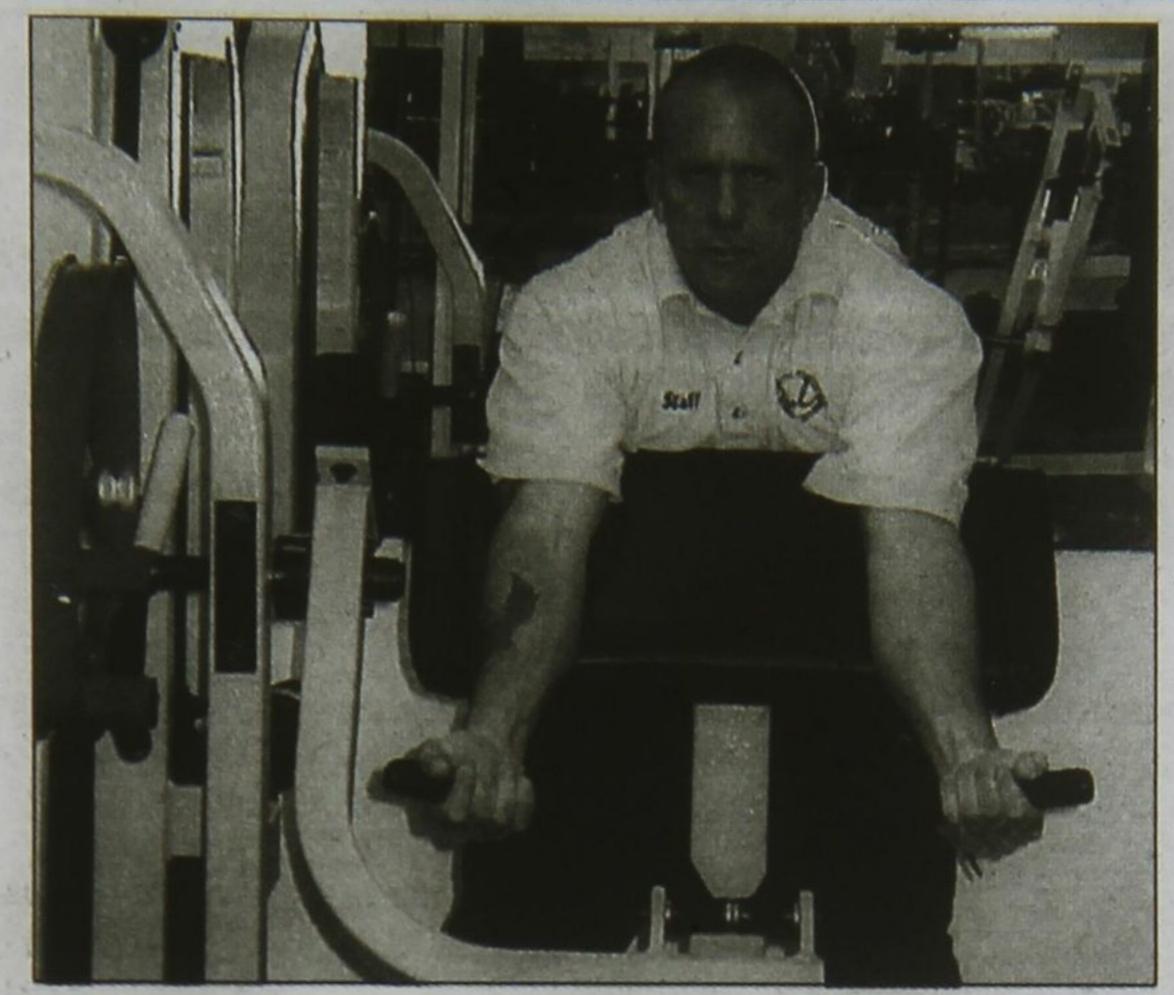
To the Editor:
