We like this by-line for it explains something of Century Mill Lumber. However, for some of our readers ( all 3½ of them),

#### it is confusing.

- "Bringing the world" indicates that some of our lumber is of a foreign nature, coming from places such as Brazil and Cameroon.
   We sell species from Avodire to Zebrawood. If these are novel woods to you, I suggest initial use be limited to accent pieces in your "objet d'art".
- 2. "By the Board Foot" indicates the measuring method used. A Board Foot is the equivalent to 1" thick x 12" wide x 12" long.

  Example a board 1'- x 6" x 4'.

One formula: a) convert all fractions to decimals and all numbers to inches;
b) multiply the 3 numbers and divide by 144

(1.5 × 6 × 48) = 3 bd. ft.

Finally: we gladly give Bruce Stapley the credit for our by-line.
