
Safety open house held at **Leisure Centre**





Readers Opinion Local MP addresses same sex marriage concerns

To the Editor:

Acknowledging the recent contention that has arisen surrounding the proposed legislation to legally recognize same sex marriages, as a Member of Parliament I had indicated from the very beginning of the discussions that I would reflect the clear majority of my constituents' views in the riding of Oak Ridges.

It is my intention at the end of the process to do just that. On record, I have as a member of the Richmond Hill Municipal Council and as a Member of Parliament supported the extension of benefits to same sex couples just as they are afforded to heterosexual couples. However, the issue before us is not one of extending equivocal benefits, discrimination or any other, but the belief that it is my responsibility to represent the electorate that have charged such duties to me.

It should be noted that regardless of the outcome of the vote in the Federal Parliament, the court decisions rendered by the Superior Courts of Ontario and British Columbia would still stand valid. Same sex marriages are legitimate under the eyes of the law in those jurisdictions.

Over the past few months, our office has been actively monitoring the sentiments in our constituency as expressed in the overwhelming volume of correspondence received. It will be an ongoing process throughout the coming months and I have appreciated the opportunities to listen to your input in facilitating my role as the elected representative of this riding.
