Expansion, renovations to continue at Whitby Mall

About one more year of expansion and renovation, including a new look to the Woolco storefront, remains at the Whitby Mall Shopping Centre and Lang Tower Offices.

With more stores added in the past year, president Anthony Lang says the mall now with more than 50 stores has become a "shopper's delight" after almost four years of expansion and modernization.

Lang says a free trade agreement between Canada and the U.S. would help the mall, the shopper and the community in general.

Free trade would bring more products to stores and improved

quality as industries compete to put forth a better product at "competitive" prices.

He sees more jobs as business improves, including employment in new local distribution centres that may spring up for American industries.

"With free trade, we can begin to grow and eventually compete with world market prices," says Lang.

He sees few changes to Canadian "identity" since American media and entertainment are already evident yet don't threaten Canadian "individuality."

The Whitby Mall first opened in

1970 with Woolco, Miracle Mart and about 20 other stores. It expanded in


1980 and the Lang Tower east wing was built to provide corporate of-



Bath Affairs at mall


Bath Affairs is the name of the newest store to open in the Whitby Mall.
