TAXING MORTGAGES.

The late B. D. Calvin, while a member of the legislature, laboured long and wearily to secure a law under which the holders of mortgages would be made to contribute to the public revenue by taxation.

What was deemed inexpedient and impossible in Ontario has been achieved in New York State. There is a law across the way which permits of the annual taxation of mortgages, and the moored influence is uneasy under it and moving for a change.

The governor, Mr. Odell, who is a business man of sound sense and discretion, anticipates the action of the assembly by making a recommendation. He comes between the disputants, and suggests a small recording tax which is to be collected by the county clerks and registrars.

But Mr. Odell would not have the taxing officer after the mortgage again and again. After it were once touched it would be free from taxation, and four mills on the dollar, it is estimated, would yield New York a revenue of \$3,000,000 annually.
