QUASHED THE CONVICTION.

POLICE MAGISTRATE WENT BEYOND HIS POWERS.

Finances Of Toronto University—Details of Sir William Macdonald's Scheme Of Rural Education Sent to the Government.

Toronto, Jan. 10.—Chief justice Meredith this morning quashed a conviction registered against John Kennedy, at P. S. 10, on which he was sentenced to four months imprisonment in the central E. B. Stone, for Kennedy, submitted that the police magistrate could not try Kennedy without his consent and the chief justice, whose respect for Magna Carta and the right of trial by jury is very marked, agreed, and quashed the conviction.

The annual report of the financial condition of Toronto university just published shows that it owns productive lands to the value of \$1,034,795, leased property worth \$478,837; investments of \$178,809 and buildings and land used for university purposes, \$1,468,695.
