IN THE RELIGIOUS WORLD.

A BIG SUM NEEDED TO COME OUT CLEAR.

The Presbyterian Church Asked to Raise \$33,000 a Week For Six Weeks - Church Building is Booming in the West.

The Christian Scientists own a \$9,000 church at Berlin.

Last Sunday the bishop of Ontario consecrated the new cathedral in St. Mark's church, Deseronto.

The Canadian Churchman protests against the presentation of the Passion Play on the stage.

The official board of the Sherbrooke Methodist church has extended a call to Rev. C. E. Bland, Montreal.

A movement is on foot to build another Methodist church in Ogdensburg, and \$6,000 has been subscribed.

The Lennox and Addington Sabbath-school association's convention will be held in Yarker, the latter part of February.

One out of every 150 in the Island of Formosa is a Christian. In China only one in every 2,000 is an adherent to Christianity.

According to the statistics of the Jewish emigration from Roumania, 9,553 Roumanian Jews came to America during the year 1900.

Russian census returns reveal the presence of 640,000 Jews among the population of 125,000,000, among for every 121 men there are 100 women.

Rev. W. McGregor, of the Westminster, is to be transferred from Toronto to Winnipeg, where he will have full charge of the western business of the company.

Rev. H. A. Naylor, B.A., a Church of England missionary in the Klondyke for six years, has been compelled by ill-health to leave his work and return to a milder climate.

Religious intolerance has taken a new turn in Russia. In certain provinces there are 130,000 dissenters.

From next year state church missionaries will be stationed in every village, and all the children will be compelled to attend the church schools.

Vancouver has an epidemic of church building in Methodist circles. For nine years there was no extension, and then Fairview church was organized and built, Mount Pleasant church enlarged, Wesley church, now opened, and Princess street bus, putting up a new edifice.

The past year has been one of great activity in Presbyterian church building in Manitoba, and within the past month churches have been opened at Moine, Clandelovo, and Mergo. The territories have had two new churches dedicated recently, at Daybreak and Coalfields.

Rev. Dr. Warren has issued a financial report of the Presbyterian church schemes for the year ending February 21st. There has been \$29,050 subscribed, but it is estimated that the amount required will be \$291,000, making a requisite of \$198,950, and in the next six weeks, to end the year without debt, upwards of \$33,000 a week, or nearly \$6,000 every day.

Hamilton Times: Rev. Dr. Milligan denies that higher criticism of the bible is inspired by the devil. The denial having been entered, it is now the turn of the evangelist to put in evidence to prove his case. Will he call Old Sooty?

There is significance in the fact that, according to the statistics of the membership of the churches of the United States compiled by Rev. Dr. Carroll, who was in charge of the religious statistics of the federal census of 1900, the membership of all our religious bodies combined at the end of the year 1901, over that at the end of 1900, had increased in large proportion than the population of the republic in the same period.

New York Mail Express: It is now in Toronto on Thursday night an informal conference of the christian unity association was held, which may be attended by the most far-reaching consequences. It is generally conceded that the money expended in mission work is wasted because of the duplication of mission stations. Leading men of the Anglican, Presbyterian and Methodist churches met and talked over the advisability of dividing up the territory in such a way as to secure the greatest possible return for the money spent and to lessen the rivalries now frequently so detrimental to the cause of religion. A committee was appointed to draft a memorial that will state the case for co-operation and will be laid before the governing bodies of the churches represented at the conference.
