(3) To assist the dominion governtransportation of the products of the farm, especially of horses, cattle and dressed beef to the markets of Great Britain, and to improve local transportation within the province, by rea son of good roads, the removal tolls and chenp electric railways. (4) To expand and increase our agricultural wealth by improved me thods of husbandry, fruit growing, dairying, cold storage and the
