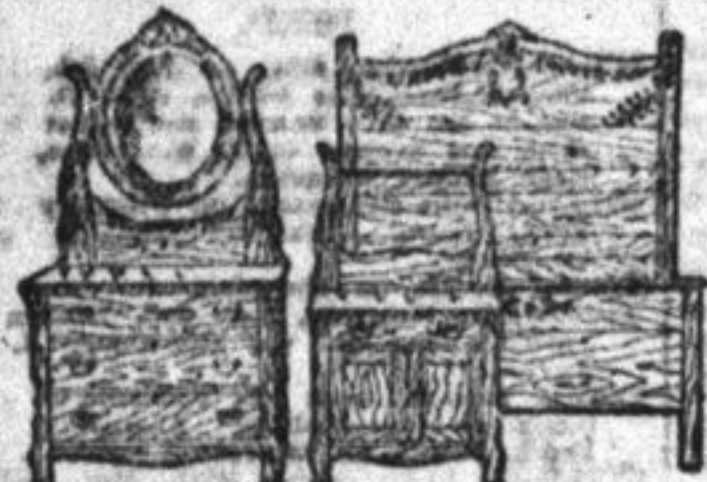

THE SMALL POX HOSPITAL CREATES A LONG DISCUSSION IN COUNCIL.

The Smelter Site Refused As a Location For a Pest House—Matter Referred Back To The Board of Health.

Communications Considered. H. W. Wilson, agent of the Lake Ontario & Bay of Quinte Navigation Company, asking city to advertise in the company's guide book—Finance committee.

Report of Finance Committee. Ald. Walkem presented the report of the committee on finance, recommending payment of the accounts: James Sowards, \$2.75; John Skelton, \$2.95; Walter Law, \$40.08; labor pay list, \$450.64; Dr. Nichols, \$30.50; J. W. Oldfin, \$8.75; John Kidd, \$3; J. Reiden & Co., \$6c; Uram & Carter, \$27.80; T. McAuley, 25c; Canadian municipal union, \$10; W. T. C. Jenkins, \$5; Bell telephone company, \$25; J. W. Lane, \$1.10; taxes received, \$9.45; J. P. Hanley, \$9.85.

Acting mayor Walkem sustained Ald. Carson's stand. Ald. Farrell and King moved that the dominion government be requested to grant a location on their property to the west of the city for a small-pox hospital, and that the Hon. William Hartley be requested to use his efforts with the government to obtain such a site, and that the property committee be requested to make further enquiries with a view to securing a suitable site.

Referring to clause two, setting apart the smelter site for a small-pox hospital, Ald. Bell was surprised that the property committee would do such an unwise thing as to give away such a valuable piece of city property as the smelter site, situated as it was in close proximity to the cotton mill, the tannery, and so close to the two railroad tracks. It would be like placing traps on the door of the largest tax paying ward of the city.

Ald. Tait gave credit to the committee for being actuated by a sense of right in desiring to set the site in question apart for a small-pox hospital, but he thought a better site might be obtained elsewhere. It would not do to place such a hospital so close to such a live industry as the cotton mill. If the city could not put a better building on the smelter site, that cost the city \$9,000, it would not be a paying investment.

Ald. Graham also opposed the plan. The building in view was not suitable for a small-pox hospital. If the chairman of the board of health and others who favored the place, thought they would like to undergo treatment in that small, unsuitable house, there would not be a word said in favor of the place. The city should take steps to provide a suitable place for a small-pox hospital.

Ald. Abbott pointed out that the board of health had done its best last year to find a suitable place for a pest house, what would the city do if a case of small-pox broke out here now? The whole province is permeated with the disease and it is likely to break out here at any moment. If the city does not make provision now, the corporation will sooner or later be left in the lurch.

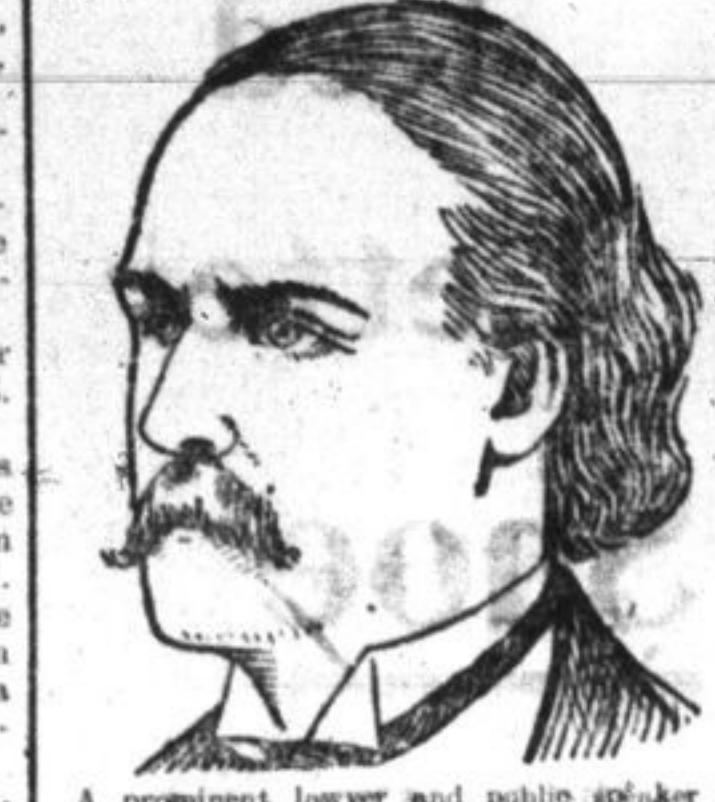
