

THE SMALL POX HOSPITAL

CREATES A LONG DISCUSSION IN COUNCIL.

Site Refused As a Location For a Pest House—Matter Referred Back To The Board Of Health.

The snow storm did not prevent the city fathers assembling on time in their places around the council board room. When the clerk called in roll these numbers answered to their names: Ald. Abbott, Carson, Craig, Graham, Harkness, Kent, King, Mallen, Sears, Tait, Walkem, White, Knapp, McDonald, Bell, Hipson, Farrell.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were adopted on motion of Alds. Farrell and Walkem.

Communications Considered.

H. W. Wilson, agent of the Lake Ontario & Bay of Quinte navigation company, asking city to advertise in the company's guide book.—Finance committee.

A. B. Cunningham, notifying council that he had been instructed by Mrs. H. Hamilton to take proceedings against the municipality to recover damages for injuries received by reason of a fall on the south side of Princess street.—Board of works.

A. B. Cunningham, asking for a fixed flat rate for water service for Clarified milk company; a meter has been in the building for six months and does not give satisfaction.—Water works committee.

New York Central & Hudson River R.R. Co., asking city to renew advertisement in guide book.—Finance committee.

Commander Spain, expressing thanks for use of city hall for investigation proceedings re. Marine City disaster.—Fired.

A. Gray, for Dominion cotton mill company, asking that the sidewalk on Mill street be widened.—Board of works.

W. A. Gray, for Dominion cotton mill company, inviting firemen to visit cotton mill with a view to familiarizing themselves with its layout.—Fire and light committee.

Smythe & Lyon, for H. J. Wilkinson, applying for usual remission of taxes granted to places where religious services are conducted; the Jews hold religious service in the hall over the board of education rooms.—Finance committee.

Report of Finance Committee.

The matter came up again under the head of resolutions, when Alds. Bell and Craig moved that the matter of providing a small-pox hospital be referred to the city property committee, to make further enquiry with a view to securing a suitable site.

Ald. Carson took the ground that the question should go back to the board of health; the property committee had reported upon the matter referred to it.

Ald. Bell pressed his amendment, saying that at a later hour he would present a resolution dealing with the matter. Ald. Bell's amendment, to strike out the clause, was put and carried, on this division:

Ald. Carson took the ground that the question should go back to the board of health; the property committee had reported upon the matter referred to it.

Ald. Bell was willing, if city property committee was unable to cope with the question, to refer the matter to some other committee.

Ald. Carson wanted Ald. Bell to understand that the property committee was not able to deal with any question referred to it. The board of health had made a request for a certain site, and the committee had referred thereto. The matter should now be referred to the board of health.

Acting mayor Walkem sustained Ald. Carson's stand.

Ald. Bell and King moved that the dominion government request the province grant a location on their property to the west of the city for the temporary location of a small-pox hospital, and that the Hon. William Harkness be requested to use his efforts with the government to obtain such site, and that the city property committee communicate with the board of health and municipal council of the township of Kingston, with the object of obtaining their co-operation in the effort to secure said site for the joint use of the city and township.
