THE CASE IS PROCEEDING. AS TO THE MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS AT MITCHELL.

Has a Magistrate Jurisdiction Under the Code to Issue a Warrant Against an Elector For Voting More Than Once? Toronto, Feb. 7.—N. W. Rowell, pleading before chief justice Meredith, the election proceedings at Mitchell and appealed against the decision of judge Barron, unseating mayor Campbell and S. R. Stewart, Alfred Blowers and Isaac Horn, councillors. These were unseated and a new election was ordered because at the time of their election they were members of the citizens' municipal league which was prosecuting a suit against the corporation to quash a by-law closing a street for the purpose of enlarging a racing track.

CAPTURED MARIAS. A Leader Of The Boers Pulled In. Matjesfontein, Cape Colony, Feb. 7.—Lourens Erasmus, better known under the name of commandant Marias, has been captured in the neighborhood of Laingsburg.

Favorable For Commercial Treaty. Victoria, B.C., Feb. 7.—In an interview in the North China News, Gen. Sharotte, United States trade commissioner, conducting tariff negotiations in China, says there is good prospect of a speedy adjustment of the new commercial treaty.

A Duty On Spirits. Melbourne, Victoria, Feb. 7.—The federal house of representatives has confirmed the clause of the tariff bill imposing an excise duty on grape spirit of eleven shillings, and has raised the excise duty on barley, malt, molasses and maize spirit to 12s. 6d.

APPENDICITIS. Specialist Declares Operations Are Urgent.

Albany Journal. A physician of Springfield, Mass., Dr. A. G. Squier, takes a view of appendicitis that differs radically from the one that is believed to be held by the majority of practitioners. In a paper which he read before the Eastern Hampden medical society a few days ago he made the assertion that from experience and observation extending over twenty years he had deduced the opinion that of all persons attacked by appendicitis, eighty per cent. will recover without an operation while the other twenty per cent. will die, whether an operation is performed or not.

Widow Gets \$10,000,000. Boston, Feb. 7.—The will of the late Charles E. Sprague bequeaths his entire estate, amounting to about \$10,000,000, to his widow, Mr. Sprague died a week ago at the Butler sanitarium, where he had been undergoing treatment for mental disorder.
