

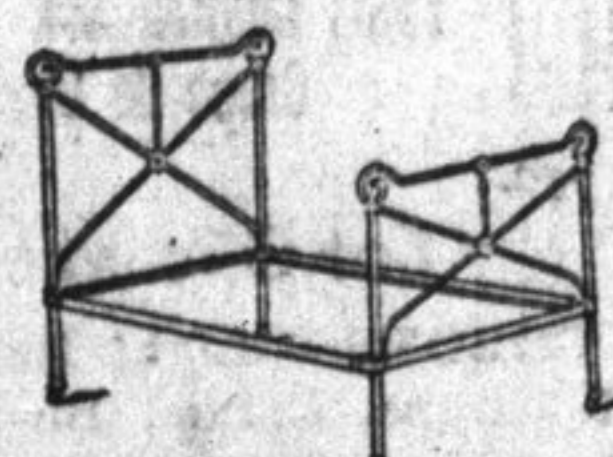

THE NATIONAL OUTLOOK. ADDRESS BY CHANCELLOR WALLACE, OF M'MASTER.

The Duty of Women is to Become Mothers, He Declared—Principal Grant Asserts His Great Faith in the Future of Canada.

The lecture last night on "The National Outlook," by Chancellor Wallace of McMaster University, Toronto, concluded Queen's alumni conference.

Passing to his subject, the chancellor claimed that it was impossible to see the fact that a mere dependency of the British empire as its population increases and its institutions grow.

When Quebec and the maritime provinces have their ten millions of people, Ontario fifteen millions, Manitoba and the north-west, fifteen millions and British Columbia, five millions; when Great Britain is little more populous, and when Canada is not so far removed from the center of the world, it is the duty of Canadian and British statesmen to grapple with the relationship of the colony to the empire.

A vital question now engaging attention, said Chancellor Wallace, is that of population. The speaker dwelt upon the necessity of turning the tide of the too low increasing Canadian population while the sufferer for to do this he had a dream of decreasing the loneliness of country life by daily postal system, traveling libraries, telephone service, multiplicity of electric lines, etc.

The Opposition Members Had Taken No Interest in It—Speech Made By Hon. Mr. Pattullo In The Ontario Legislature.

In his speech in the debate on the budget, on Tuesday, Mr. Hoyle, of North Ontario, discussed at some length the subject of technical education. He praised the school of technical education, (now known as the Ontario College of Practical Science), as the best institution of the kind on the continent, and criticized the government's treatment of it.

The Ontario government, he said, had the foresight and sagacity to take up technical training. They had shown themselves responsive to advanced public opinion, to new conditions and to the new problems of the present age.

They realized the necessity of agricultural education, of manual training, of domestic science, and of technical education, and were re-adjusting their educational work to modern requirements. If that Mr. Hoyle, of North Ontario, made a vigorous reply to these strictures on the government.

But Mr. Hoyle had done more than this without suggestion or help from the opposition. He realized that one city was not all Ontario, that with our growing north there should be more seats of learning than one.

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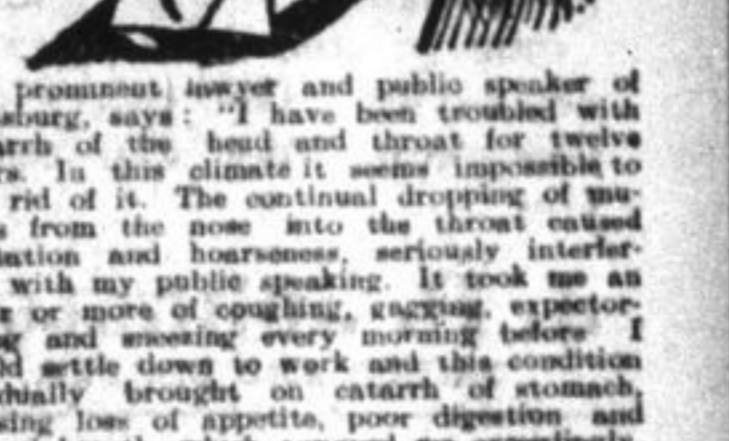
