Winnipeg is agitating for Sunday street cars.

The United States express company has increased the pay of its messengers.

At Oswego in 1901 there were 152 building permits granted. The buildings cost \$192,365.

The reassembling of the Brussels sugar conference has been postponed till next Monday.

Right Rev. Henry Brougham Bousfield, bishop of Pretoria, is dead. He was born in 1832.

Mrs. R. Davis was knocked down by a trolley car in Utica, N.Y., on Saturday and killed.

Henry Irving, the actor, celebrated his sixty-fourth birthday at Rochester, N.Y., on Thursday last.

A scandalous piercer M. M. Book's thigh at a Hamilton ice-house, and he was taken to the hospital in a serious condition.

By a decision of the United States court of appeal about 250 soldiers sent to penitentiary by courts-martial will be liberated.

A fire in the engine department of the Rutland co. shops, Malone, N.Y., on Thursday, did great damage, and the loss is heavy.

Lord Kitchener's weekly report shows sixty-nine Boers killed and 574 taken prisoners, which together with wounded, totals 717.

James E. Phillips, Washakie, Ont., died of heart failure at his home this morning. He was born in Camden, and leaves a wife and family.

An Italian named Gasparoli was shot and killed at Sault Ste. Marie, by a fellow countryman, whose house he was trying to break into.

George Cadbury, who has bought the London Daily News, will make social reform a feature of his journal, and exclude betting and turf news.

William West, the old-time minister, who in his day was one of the great fun-makers of the burnt-cork profession, is dying of cancer in the stomach.

John C. Nicolai, the Buffalo patrolman, missing since December 1st, has been found in a Chicago hospital suffering from injuries received in a railroad accident.

A private letter from South Africa to the Daily Province newspaper of Vancouver, B.C., speaks of a threatened mutiny among the Canadian troops in South Africa.

Capt. J. L. Costigan, ordnance officer of H. M. gun wharf, Halifax, N.S., died this morning. He was a native of Scotland, and came to this station six years ago.

The engagement is announced in Hamilton, of Miss Ebel Lovring, second daughter of Mrs. W. J. Lovring, to W. G. Angus, late of Montreal and now of Hamilton.

It is stated that it is improbable that the new trans-Atlantic passenger fares under the agreement between the various steamship lines will be adopted before next August 1st.

Four masked men entered the office of George Hill, a contractor of Elizabethport, N.J., on Thursday last, and after gagging the watchman, carried off \$2,500 in money.

The C. P. R. Express from St. John, with immigrants from the steamer Ionian, was wrecked near Moose Head Lake. One passenger was killed and twelve were injured.

The Madrid cabinet has authorized the duke of Almodovar, minister of foreign affairs, to sign a treaty of friendship with the United States, after it has been considered by the council of state.

Earl Grey has sailed on the steamship Germanic, on his way to visit Lord Minto, where the countess has preceded him. He is intimately associated with Cecil Rhodes in commercial enterprises.

The agreement submitted by the county and city committees for the separation of the county of Oxford and city of Woodstock, was formally signed to Monday night by the respective committees.

Capt. Norton has given notice to ask Mr. Baedek whether the British government will all the circumstances connected with the purchase of remnants in the United States.

The operation for the separation of the Hindoo temples, Boring and Boring, was photographed by cinematograph operators. The pictures are to be used for the information of scientists only.

Earl Grey is interested in a trust starting public houses all over England on reformed lines. In them only the best liquors are sold and all profits, after paying five per cent. to shareholders, are to be devoted to objects of public utility.

Mrs. Charles Kearson, Galt, Ont., who resided with her daughter, Mrs. Ed. Codling, is dead of injuries sustained by falling down the cellar stairs. Mrs. Kearson was born in Barrie, nearly sixty-seven years ago. Her mother was a woman of title. She leaves ten children.

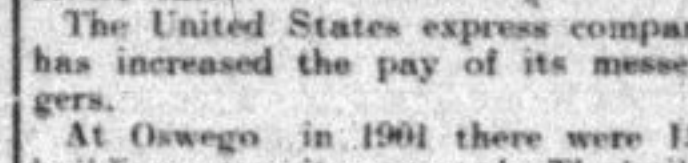

How She Died. Watertown, N.Y., Feb. 11.—Christian science is held responsible for the death of Miss May M. Dodge, fifty years old, a leader of the christian scientists here, and a healer according to Mrs. Eddy's doctrine. Her death was due to typhoid fever. Miss Dodge would not yield to her relatives' entreaties to see a physician, and when on the day of her death her wishes were disregarded and a doctor was called, she refused to allow her temperature to be taken or to be treated. She died believing she was not ill.
