PUBLIC SENTIMENT NEEDED.

Prohibitory Laws Cannot Be Enforced Without It.

New York, Feb. 17.—The west, as well as in the east, are coming to perceive and admit that prohibitory laws cannot be enforced in any community where public sentiment does not sustain the policy, and that it is worse than useless to apply laws of that sort in such a community.

Equally striking statements just made by one of the most prominent men in Kansas, himself an earnest opponent of the liquor traffic, ex-governor Morrill, that "there are many places in the state where public opinion does not sustain the prohibitory policy, and that the law cannot be enforced where public opinion is against it;" and of the Topeka Advocate, the prohibition organ, that "the law is not administered in deference to public opinion against it, 'tis more injurious to the morals of the state as a whole than the licensed saloon;" that "it is a pretext in most communities for public officials to take booties;" that "in many counties blood money is exacted from the joint keeper by the county attorney down to the councilmen, and that the effect is damaging to the future greatness of the state."

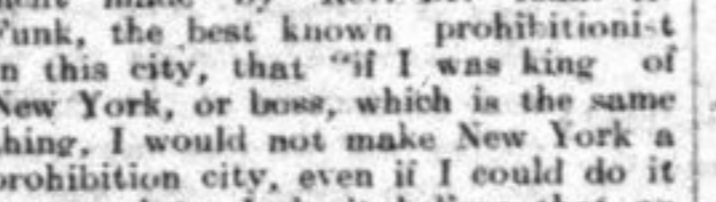
