

FABULOUS PROFITS IN N.P.R.

Stood to Make \$140,000,000. Montreal, Feb. 22,-James J. Hill, president of the Northern securities Teompany, has been giving some interesting particulars regarding the corner which took place in Northern Pacific stock and profit that might have been made by lords Mount Stephen and Strathcona had they thrown the immense holdings on the markets. These facts were brought out before the investigation now being held regarding the Hill-Morgan merger. The control his stock went up from par to con a share, but no large transactions occurred at over \$700, so that had the syndicate sold they would have realized \$140,000,000. Lord Strathcona is known to hold 30,000 of the common stock and lord Mount Stephen, to 000, while other of their friends in Montreal hold about as much again. Their profits then would have been for ord Strathcona \$21,000,000, and for ford Mount Stephen 87,000,000.
