(New York, Feb. 21.)—In my letter of last week I referred to the movement that is now being made of food reform. A great many people think that this is one of the most important of our present legislators. One reformer comes out with a motto, "Let me what you eat and I'll tell you what you are."

Now for the food reform. It's hard to believe that in eight cases out of ten when food is prepared for the public two-thirds of it is more or less adulterated. The article of which I am now going to speak may be regarded as the most deadly and most contemptible swindle ever practiced on a confiding people. We will take for instance a subject of national importance—California wines. The advocating of temperance has brought us so far with many interesting facts and it is pretty well settled where a pure and comparatively harmless stimulant can be found that with careful, reasonable use stimulates and does not destroy the man, either physically or mentally and leads to happier results than total abstinence.

beneath the stars and stripes, that slavery might not disgrace the grandest republic ever known to man since the creation of the world. Long years ago and a score of years they were when they left old "Faderland" and "Muderland" and Hartshubers to journey across thousands of miles of sea and build a new home, often in the wilderness and become citizens heart and hand as well as any of our own flesh and blood, and in the hour of their success and progress never forgot that other land from which they came, loyal in their hearts a love and loyalty which death alone could extinguish. It is only a few years ago since a representation of one of our best and most honored institutions made up their minds that they would go back to old faderland and congratulate the present emperor on his accession to the imperial seat of the German empire. How were these wanderers received? Not with scanty welcomes and cold civility, but with the royal generosity which has ever distinguished German social organizations at home or abroad. At the German capital all business was suspended, and for the first time in the memory of men, old German etiquette was lost sight of, and the home of the German emperor was free and open to the citizens of any other land that joined in that great national jubilee.

At the banquet, which was given in honor of the German American visitors, the stars and stripes were entwined with the colors of the royal German empire and associated with the same honors as the German flag which crushed the great power of France on the battlefield of Sedan. Hanged around that grand hall were the names of Lincoln and Grant entwined in the same colors as Bismarck and Von Moltke, the likeness of Washington was placed alongside of Frederick the Great, who represents to the German and American heart to-day all that is noble and heroic in the two immortal patriots of which history bears any record. One of our troublesome questions at the present time is how to furnish a proper government for the people who have just secured from Spain and who are ignorant of our laws, religion and language. Like our new heritage, we have taken charge of millions of barbarous savages who roam their native wilds in a condition as primitive as those of our first parents, when they wandered through the fields of paradise. They have made no step of advance since Balboa and Pizarro looked over that tremendous expanse of a peaceful sea, which we now call the Pacific ocean. When these savages first saw the representatives of the new and advancing civilization they looked upon them with wonder and awe, later on with the bitterness of hate which finds no parallel within the limits of our language. It would seem as though the question of this latest accession to our republic could only be settled by their extermination. It appears like a hard alternative, but self preservation is the first law of nature.
