In a talk on the latter subject Mrs. Susan Young Gates, of Utah, declared that woman physically had degenerated and in the struggle for intellectual greatness, which she had been making during the last half century, had forgotten the great mission of her being.

Turkish Vail To Be Recalled. London, Feb. 25.—Enis Pasha, vail of Aleppo, is about to be recalled, says the Constantinople correspondent of the Times.

In 1895 Enis was vail of Dier Bekir (Armenia), and carried out the massacre there. He was recalled at the peremptory request of the powers, but was appointed to the post at Aleppo eighteen months ago. As the massacre has forbidden the consuls to hold intercourse with Enis the sultan is forced to recall him.

To Promote Good Feeling. Berlin, Feb. 25.—Taking advantage of the great enthusiasm in America over Prince Brury's visit, the initial steps are already completed in the formation of a German society whose object is the winning of mutually friendly feeling in America and Germany. The committee consists of Herr Bruckler, its chairman; Cappi Castelle, a government official; and a representative of the Sta. Zeitung, of the name of Bratter.

Hearing In Bingham Case. Kansas City, Mo., Feb. 25.—The case of Hollis Bingham, charged with forgery, came up for hearing. Bingham is alleged to have sold property, owned by his mother, and secured \$20,000. When indicted he fled and nothing was heard of him until two weeks ago, when he appeared voluntarily in Texas. He is to be brought back for trial.
