TELEGRAMS FROM THE FOUR QUARTERS OF THE EARTH.

Matters That Interest Everybody.—Notes From All Over—Little of Everything Easily Read and Remembered.

Vaccination is now obligatory in France within the first year from birth. Stratford board of trade re-organize with a \$5 membership fee and a paid secretary.

Byron O. Lott was nominated for the legislature by the liberals of North Hastings. The year has invited emperor Francis Joseph to attend a hunting party in Poland in September.

A new steel steamer for the Lumsden fleet on Lake Temiscamingue and Kippewa will be built this year. These are thirteen cases of small-pox in the little town of West Bangor, about seven miles from Malone, N.Y.

Ex-treasurer C. D. Thompson, of the Macabees, has been arrested at Port Huron, charged with the larceny of \$37,000. William Douglas, while working at a mill dam at Port Hope, was knocked into the water, swept away and drowned.

Dr. Saunders, director of the experimental farm at Ottawa, is of the opinion that best sugar production cannot be secured in Canada. At Albany, N.Y., governor Odell authorized the extradition of Joseph W. Blodgett to Massachusetts to answer the charge of wife murder.

Charles H. Warren, vice-president of the Central railway, of New Jersey, has resigned his position to accept service with another railway. M. W. Rossie, connected with the Toronto Mail and Empire staff, is leaving for London, where he assumes the editorship of the Advertiser.

The Canadian society of New York will tender Dr. H. Drummond a complimentary dinner at the Arkwright club, New York, on March 12th. Hon. Joseph Royal, ex-governor of the north-west territories, is about to give up journalistic work in the east and in Manitoba will re-enter politics.

Next Saturday a deputation of the C. P. railway trackmen will wait upon the management at Montreal and present their claims for more wages and a working hour schedule. The French cable ship Admiral Coubet, arrived at St. John's, Nfld., on Sunday, having been disabled by the heavy seas and ice en route.

The movement towards provincial autonomy is seriously considered in the north-west territories. Manitoba is interested in the creation of western provinces and a definition of their boundaries. The Grand Trunk railway system has included in its list of summer and winter resorts it is bringing before the public the sanitarium at St. Catharines, Ont., a retreat for rest and recuperation.

Crowell brothers, hardware and ship chandlery establishment, Halx, was destroyed by fire on Sunday. The building was heavily insured. Their valuable stock, adjoining their warehouse, was badly burned. Mr. White, the American ambassador at Berlin, has received a cable despatch, sent by prince Henry, at the moment of his departure from Hoboken, expressing gratitude for his cordial reception in America.

Terlingen will be taken to Berlin for trial on a charge of defrauding several banks in Prussia out of \$350,000.
