The Generous Act Will Likely be Met by One Equally Chivalrous-Methuen is Said to Suffer From an Equally Dangerously Fractured Thigh.

Methuen's release is considered to be strong. It is pointed out that Gen. Delarey could not afford to hamper the mobility of his force by the care of a distinguished prisoner with a dangerously fractured thigh, and even if he were able to place him somewhere safe from harm he would not likely be able to obtain the necessary medical attention and comforts. However, if Gen. Methuen was free, unconditionally, it is expected Gen. Delarey's generous act will be immediately recognized by one equally chivalrous, and a Boer prisoner, corresponding in rank with Gen. Methuen will be sent to the Boer lines. It is suggested that either Gen. Cronje or Gen. Viljoen would be a fair exchange.
