NO MORE SPANIARDS AMONG THE BISHOPS.

Decision in Reference to Catholic Work in Philippines—American Interests To Be Considered.

Rome, March 22.—Mgr. Sharretti, the papal delegate to the Philippines who is on his way to the Philippines by way of New York and San Francisco, will make a brief stop at Washington in order to consult the United States government in connection with Philippine affairs.

The story that he is taking with him a papal bull providing for the re-establishment of a hierarchy is authoritatively denied. The Vatican authorities intend to hold the matter in abeyance until the situation in the Philippines becomes more settled.

It has been decided to appoint no more Spaniards among the new bishops. As a result of this decision, Mr. Hozaleda, archbishop of Manila, now here, has tendered his resignation and will proceed to Spain, where he will hereafter reside.

Sharretti Has Authority.

Paris, March 22.—A dispatch from Rome to the Paris edition of the New York Herald, says that the pope, when speaking to a cardinal, said he had given Mgr. Sharretti full power to negotiate the Philippine question at Washington, and that the pontiff expressed the opinion that an agreement satisfactory to all parties would be reached, although Washington insisted upon not recognizing the monastic orders in the Philippine islands as legal bodies.
