YUKON DELEGATION TO ASK SIFTON TO MAKE CHANGES.

Yukon Bishopric—Movement To Create New Roman Catholic Bishop—Canadian Wins Prize—Welland Canal Opening.

Ottawa, March 26.—Ald. Arthur Wilson, Dawson City, and J. F. Sugrue, a Klondyke miner, are here to wait on Hon. Mr. Sifton to-morrow to ask the government to make changes in the Treadgold concession in regard to the water privileges and the price charged for the water to miners on the creeks of the Klondyke river.
