The position of the Hamilton Herald on the guarantee companies is a really sound one. These companies go in to the assurance business upon its merits. They agree, for a certain consideration, to become the surety of the individuals in their dealings with the employers.

Thus, for a certain premium per annum, they agree to see that the employees perform their duties faithfully, and, above all, that they give a correct accounting of all the moneys that pass through their hands.

There is a law of average which is exceedingly instructive. It indicates that in a certain total of experience there is a percentage which is peculiar, and this percentage in the guarantee business represents the lapses from grace, the defaults and the defects.

Should the defaulter be prosecuted, then? Assuredly. No man should have his dishonesty condoned, but he only should be troubled by the company. His friends were not assured by the company, and they should be spared the effect of any proceedings which carry with them a great moral lesson.

EXPANSION OF TRADE IN CANADIAN DAIRY PRODUCTS.

What the Dominion Department of Agriculture Does For the Farmer And the Exporter—Attractive Source of Investment.

He is Charged With Taking \$10,000 Bribe Money.

Butte, Mont., April 1.—A sensation has been caused by the declaration in court of attorneys and a former associate and business partner of John C. Paulsen, former state architect, that the latter had not committed suicide five years ago as reported and generally believed but that he is still alive and probably residing with his family in Germany.

Paulsen was charged with having collected nearly \$10,000 in bribe money from contractors, who built state educational buildings and subsequently promised to make restitution. He went to his home in Helena for the alleged purpose of procuring the money, but the following day he was reported dead, the statement being made that he had committed suicide.
