DEATH OF THE ASSISTANT. A POWER COMPANY TO RAISE NEW FUND.

To Arrange For Power For Montreal-Speculation On The Wild Side On The Montreal Stock Exchange.

Montreal, April 4. - M. Emery, assistant postmaster, of Montreal, from 1873 to 1891, died here, this morning. The Shawanigan Falls power company at a special meeting of shareholders, to-day, decided to issue \$3,000,000 of four and a half per cent. thirty year gold bonds of which \$1,500,000 will be issued to retire a like amount of the company's funds and the balance is to be used for the extension of the company's power to this city.

The trading in Dominion steel, common on the stock market this morning reached a total of about 12,000 shares. After the rise to 69 1/2, the market sold off on heavy profit taking and towards the close, at noon, had a rather soft appearance. ANGRY AT GOVERNMENT. Man Found Dead With Bullet In His Head.

Winnipeg, April 4. - It appears from a statement published this morning that notices were sent to referendum officers, by attorney-general Campbell to the effect that voters could ballot only in the sub-division in which they resided.

Niagara Falls, Ont., April 3. - A young lady, whose name, according to notes she left, is Della Tansey, Ruffalo, plunged into the water of the falls from the new concrete arch connecting Green Island with the mainland, this afternoon, and her body was carried to the brink of the American Falls, where, when last seen at nightfall, it still remained caught on the ice.

UNDER QUARANTINE. Towns Appeal To State Board Of Health.

Ogdensburg, N.Y., April 4. - The epidemic of small-pox at Ogdensburg, in an alarming extent and the state board of health has been notified. Near by towns are greatly alarmed over the increasing number of cases and have appealed to the health department to seal off the state officers and place the village under quarantine.

JEFFRIES AND FITZSIMMONS To Meet In Fistic Battle At Charleston, N. C.

New York, April 4. - Jeffries and Fitzsimmons will meet at Charleston, N.C., to fight for the world's championship. THE TIDINGS IN TORONTO. ORDINARILY CARRUTHERS WOULD LEAD "A" TROOP.

The Canadians Were Chiefly From Toronto And Its Neighbourhood-Capt. Elmsley Was The Captain.

Toronto, April 4. - News of the heavy fighting in South Africa was read with great interest here, as it is probable that many Torontonians were in the troops which suffered so severely. Lieut. Carruthers was senior subaltern in "E" squadron, of which Capt. Elmsley was in command, and which was raised in No. 2 military district, of which Toronto is the centre. Ordinarily, Lieut. Carruthers would command "A" troop.
