THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

AT ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRADE.

President McKelvey Gives a Clear Review of the Business of the Year - The Peculiar Position the Board Occupies - The Questions Dealt With.

At last night's meeting of the board of trade president McKelvey submitted the following annual report to the members of the Kingston board of trade... In presenting a report of the transactions of the board throughout the year now closing, your council would first call attention to the peculiar position a board of trade occupies in the business life of a community.

The year during which your council has held office has not presented for consideration any new business of great direct importance to the city, and there is no important commercial transaction of local interest to report.

K. & P. Railway. Early in the year upon representations made to your council, recognition was given to the advantage of having a railway opened up through the section between Sherbrooke and Carleton Place, which would afford a short cut through Lanark county to the Ottawa route and would also allow the development of mining, manufacturing and agricultural enterprises in the section opened up.

Grand Trunk Railway. Upon receiving a petition from the Kingston Knights of the Grip, asking assistance to procure an early morning service from Kingston to points east on the G.T.R., your council presented to the minister of customs a petition condemning the practice of requiring steamship, railway and ferry companies to pay for the services of officers and landing waiters rendered outside of a certain port of call.

Bell Telephone Company. Legislation now under consideration at Ottawa in regard to the telephone companies was not considered by the finance committee of the city council to be of any direct interest to Kingston in view of the existing contract between the city and the Bell telephone company, but in the light of representations received, your council thought it well to express its views.

should not be increased without the consent of the government-in-council. Applications for leave to increase their rates were subsequently refused. Notwithstanding this, the company is said to have continually increased their rates in various municipalities with new subscribers, and during the last session of the dominion parliament numerous petitions were sent in from all over Canada, asking for relief.

Mining Resources. Your council recommended to the director of the geological survey that the Pan American at Kingston would afford a splendid opportunity to advertise the mineral resources of the district, and the showing was made that a map, showing the geological formation of the counties of Frontenac and Lanark, should be prepared.

The Post Office. Many efforts have been made to obtain for Kingston a proper post office building. It has been urged that the old building could be used for a number of years, and that the long term which are at present scattered on different streets, and the new building could find an excellent location on the ground between the customs house and post office. Rents saved should meet interest on the cost of construction.

Manufacturing Industries. Throughout the year correspondence has taken place with a number of manufacturing concerns alleged to contemplate a change of location. In most cases it has been clear that the bonus question has been the largest element under consideration, and in one or two it has transpired that correspondence has doubtless been carried on merely to bring some other matter to the attention of the government.

Copyright. The Canadian copyright act of 1889, having failed to receive imperial sanction, and the question having never reached a satisfactory settlement since, this board was asked by the board of trade of Toronto, in December last, to support that body in urging upon the government the desirability of passing such legislation as would give effect to a bill in regard to copyright, which was considered in 1905, but which also never became law.

Customs Tariffs. The board was asked by the branch board of trade to endorse a resolution passed by that body condemning the present customs tariff. Your council had taken action earlier in the year in placing before the government its views with reference to the difficult position in which the Canadian woolen industry is placed, and is of the opinion that it is not only its duty but its duty to assist in bringing about the best trade conditions possible, and that this must be done by intelligent, positive and helpful suggestions and recommendations, and not by negative faultfinding, and for this reason could not join in the branch board resolution.

Queen's University. Your council notes with pleasure the progress made in the new buildings on Queen's campus. The arts building donated by the city is now about complete, and the two other large buildings, erected through the liberality of the Ontario government, are well under way. These two are to be devoted to the science branches and will prove of material benefit to the whole country as well as to our immediate vicinity.

Imperial Defences. A resolution of the British Columbia branch of the Navy League upon this subject which has just been received seems so important that it is being submitted for the opinion of the full board at the annual meeting. The subject will probably form part of the programme for discussion at the conference of colonial premiers at the coronation processions in London and the League might do well to express an opinion.

The enforcement of the St. James' theater, London, England, of the new rule preventing late comers from taking their seats before the fall of the curtain does not appear to have caused any serious trouble. One reporter writes: "When the period for closing the doors came, a few of the 'golden-crown' time, and there was the faint twinkling of a bell. The few vacant seats were not filled until the curtain fell on the first act, but there was not the slightest disturbance.
