

Early Canadian Methodism. the first regularly sent Methodis missionary to Upper Canada was Rev. William Losee. He came to the province in 1790, and began his regular work in Adolphustown, that year. It was there, in 1791, Sunday, February 20th, that the first class in the province was regularly formed, in Paul Huff's house, on Hay Bay. It was on the same lot in 1792 that the first Methodist church was built, the remains of which are still standing. I may be as well to mention just her day, February 27th.
