PROCEEDING TO HALIFAX.

RECRUITS BEING STEADILY SWORN IN. Fifty Secured so Far at Montreal. The Advances and Drops on the Stock Exchange. Montreal, April 18.—Thirty of the recruits, so far selected in the city for the fourth contingent for South Africa, left for Halifax at noon by the intercolonial train. They were accompanied by a small contingent of western recruits. The selection is going on at the drill and besides the thirty who have departed, eighteen have been sworn in. There was no ceremony attending the departure of to-day's draft, the men marching to station, accompanied only by a few of their friends.

Price of the Dominion stock issues were strong in the stock market to-day, common rising from 69 to 71 1/2, and reacting to 70 at the end of forenoon. Preferred sold as high as 104 and as low as 92. Bonds were steady at 92 1/2 to 93. Nova Scotia stock sold up to 114 from 110 and then back to 113. Toronto mills were buoyant, selling up to 113, reacting a half and Twin City reached the same price level.

The government has closed a contract with the Allan line to carry the Canadian contingent contingent from Montreal to Liverpool on the British leaving here June 7th. There will be a notable party of passengers on that steamer, including his excellency, lord Minto, lady Roby Elliott, premiers Murray, of Nova Scotia; Tweedie, of New Brunswick; and others, of Prince Edward Island.

CRIMES' ACT DISCUSSED

JOHN REDMOND IN A SPEECH THREATENS RETALIATION. Irish Nationalist Leader Says There is an "Infamous English Conspiracy to Foment Crime in Ireland." London, April 15.—In the house of commons, yesterday, John Redmond, the Irish nationalist leader, spoke of the crimes act proclamation issued by the lord lieutenant of Ireland, earl Cadogan. He said that an infamous conspiracy was on foot in England to foment crime in Ireland, where no crime existed. The stories of outrage and violence in Ireland were infamous calumnies. The nationalists in Ireland were only governed by a contemptible policy. This statement was cheered by the Irish members. A hundred men, Mr. Redmond continued, stood ready to replace every man sent to prison in this struggle. They grieved Mr. Wyndham, the chief secretary for Ireland, to change his policy; but if he continued it they would meet him face to face, and give blow for blow. Their answer to his coercion of Ireland would be to harden their hearts, strengthen their organization and compel redress.
