LESSONS OF A TRAGEDY. The shooting affair of yesterday - one of the most lamentable and regrettable incidents that has ever occurred in Kingston - sets one moralizing.

The age has its advantages and disadvantages. The children of to-day have privilege, amusements (innocent enough and numerous enough), and outings and educational facilities that were denied to their parents.

The home and the school are expected to give direction and bent to the youthful character. In the one the children get (or ought to get) the training that contributes to true manhood and true womanhood.

What of the school? It is the creation of the times in which we live. Its teachers represent a high type of scholarship, and in the mental development of the young they are eminently efficient.

The school of the day should be a place where the impulses, as well as the mind of the individual may be disciplined. The tragedy of yesterday, viewed from any side, is a mortifying instance of defective habits.

THE TORIES GAVE CONSENT. The charge, repeatedly made by the conservative speakers and conservative press, is that the liberals, led by the government of this province, have been giving away huge pulpwood areas, and that the agreements in regard to them were secretly made.

London, April 22.-The Canadian officials here are highly excited over the reports received yesterday that the shipping combination with two Canadian lines in it is already interfering with the systematized operations of the highly organized bureau of the highly organized W. T. K. Preston confirmed yesterday the report that the two representatives of the shipping ring had threatened to divert emigration from Canada unless the work of the sub-agents, appointed throughout the United Kingdom for promoting it without prejudice to any line, was restricted.

Trooper Scott, of Kingston, Took Part in a Boer Drive.

David Scott, watchman for George Robertson & Sons, yesterday received a very interesting letter from his son, trooper D. G. Scott, second Canadian mounted rifles. After describing his experience in crossing the ocean, during which time he suffered somewhat from mal-de-mer, and found the heat oppressive in crossing the equator, the writer states that the steamer stopped at Cape Town long enough to land four cases of small-pox and a number of cases of measles; thence the steamer proceeded to Durban, where the troops debarked.

The writer saw Spion Kop, that famous battle mountain, the grave of other interesting sights. While at Newcastle three Boers entered the camp and surrendered themselves; after getting a good meal they wanted to leave, but they were detained. At the time of writing the Canadians were expected to get into action without any loss of time.
