A PLAN TO GET AROUND THE

OBJECTIONS.

It is Suggested That Britain Enter Into a Treaty For the Incorporation of the Two Republics With the British Em-

London, April 25 .- The Pail Mall Gazette publishes a statement, from a reliable and trustworthy correspondent at The Hague, who claims that he represents the views of the Dutch government in the matter of the peace negotiations between the British government and the Boers. "The great difficulty in the way of peace," the correspondent says, "lies in the form of the words, that the republics must forfeit their independence, and unless this difficulty can be got over by the use of a different phrase or phrases, the Netherlands government are not very hopeful of the termination of the

war at present. "While some of the Boer leaders are highly educated and intelligent men, and realize that their independence must be forfeited, many of their followers are rough and ignorant and these latter have had the word 'independence' so dinned into their ears since the Majuba fiasco, when many of them were children, that many

would never consent to forfeit it. "There should, however, be no great difficulty in arranging this matter if the British would agree to leave out the objectionable words altogether and attain what would practically be the same end, by, for example, entering into a treaty for the incorporation of the two republics with the British empire, or some similar phrase which would give the lower class Boers an idea that they were not
