THE CAPITAL TIDINGS. PARLIAMENTARY SESSION NEARING A CLOSE.

Signs of Weariness—Mr. Mulock's Bill—Shortening the Time Between Ottawa and Kingston—A Story of the Drama.

Ottawa, May 5.—A good deal of private legislation has been disposed of during the past week. Besides a number of government bills, as well as nearly the whole of the main railway estimates, the latter having occupied a little more than three days.

Something has been said lately in the press as to the failing health of the prime minister. As a matter of fact he is much as usual, bright, keen and alert, and strangely enough he is the only man in parliament who calls the traits of the late Sir John A. Macdonald, in many ways, a respite both personally and in certain general habits.

There are probably applications enough before the department of militia from officers to fill comfortably four coronation contingents. So far only the commanding and a sergeant in command have been appointed.

Citizens Who Have Decided to Settle in Europe Because of Grievances at Home. New York, May 5.—Two well known residents of New York have announced their purpose of shaking the dust of America from their feet, and of hereafter making their home over the seas.
