OPPOSITION LACKS POLICY. WHITNEY AND HIS FOLLOWERS DO NOT AGREE. The Tax on Corporations—Premier Ross Discusses the Vexed Subject—Rousing Meeting at Dundas.

Dundas, May 3.—Premier Ross spoke here last night in the interests of R. A. Thompson, who is opposing A. R. Wardell, father of the late conservative whip. Mr. Ross carried his audience with him, and concluded with one of his well-known bursts of eloquence.

Every elector is asked to reflect on the record of the Ontario administration and to decide these questions: "Is it able?" "Has it done good work?" "Is it honest?"

They do the tail wag the dog, or the dog wag the tail? Who are leading the conservative party? Is it those who favor railway subsidies, or Whitney, who opposes them?

Mr. Whitney is opposed to Mr. Dryden's investment in a bank stock ranch, yet he takes Mr. Crawford round with him, who is vice-president of the Dakota ranch.

The Premier explained the tax on corporations, and the parties attitudes to it. Last year, he said, the banks of Ontario, with assets of \$218,000,000, were taxed \$43,479.

Mr. Carleton, of Hamilton, is telling the electors that he tried to get an export duty put on nickel matte and he was defeated by the government.

Lord Roberts has ordered that tests be made of the Ross rifle. The Conservatives have no definite policy proposed by their leader.
