a Marquette club dinner. "It was simple, yet effective," said in explanation. "We had to have some means of forcing the natives to cure until I came here. Whenever natives who were rounded up refused to divulge information they were formed in line and told that they must die. Then they had to draw lots, and the native who got the black ball was taken out into the tall grass and told to prepare for death. The soldiers were drawn up in regular squad, with their guns pointing at the victim,

and at his feet in the tall grass there was a soldier who lay on his face so that he was not seen. "The order to fire was given, soldier shot over the head of the native and at the same instant the hid natives, for they thought that the man was dead.

"After three or four sacrifices had been made in this manner the natives generally fell on their knees and told all they knew."

Berlin, May, 6 .- The illness of queen Wilhelmina is watched with especial interest in Germany, because both the heir-apparent and the heir-presumptive to the Dutch throne are Germans. Under the law of succession in Holland, which was adopted in 1884, the ruling grand duke of the grand duchy of Saxe-Weimer, William Ernest, inherits the crown in the event of queen Wilhelmina dying without issue.
