PREMIER ROSS' ADDRESS

A BRILLIANT SPEECH MADE AT ST. CATHARINES.

Dominion Conservatives Desire to Capture Ontario, Not to Develop and Improve the Province, But as a Stepping-Stone for Future Victory in a Dominion Election.

During the political meeting at St. Catharines, on Tuesday, premier Ross referred to the evident desire of the conservatives representing the party in the dominion parliament to capture Ontario at this election, in order to facilitate their course to victory in the next dominion election.

Mr. Ross then went on to say: If it is reasonable that the provincial government should not enter into any alliance with the dominion government which would lead to any sacrifice of provincial rights, it is not equally fair that those who represent the conservative party in the dominion parliament should not combine against us in Ontario, with a view to securing our overthrow.

WAS A PAPINEAU VETERAN

DIED TO-DAY IN OTTAWA AGED EIGHTY-TWO.
