Does Not Believe That People Are in Danger of a Future Hell - This Rochester Clergyman Says the Church is Not Establishing the Kingdom of Heaven Here Below.

Rochester, N.Y., May 15.-Rev. William Thurston Brown, of Plymouth Congregational church, the minister who performed the marriage ceremony of Mr. George D. Herron and Miss Carrie Rand in New York a year ago...

When I made a choice of what to call it, "The Christian Ministry and I" was not because I felt that men and women were in danger of a future hell...

At first, like many another clergyman, my mind dulled and stupified by the teachings I had received, I was inclined to blame individuals for those social conditions which make all our talk of "brotherhood" and "fatherhood" a species of hypocrisy...

Accepting the ideas of origin and development as enunciated by Darwin and others, my whole thought of social problems and personal duty has radically changed.

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PASSED THROUGH FIRE.

James Taylor's Story of His Suffering and Escape.

New York, May 15.-James Taylor, one of the others of the Erasmus, the Quebec line steamer, destroyed in the harbor of St. Pierre, gives a graphic account of the tragedy of last Thursday, says a despatch to the Herald from St. Kitts, island of St. Christopher, B.W.I.:

"Suddenly I heard a tremendous explosion. Ashes began to fall thicker upon the deck, and I could see a black cloud sweeping down upon us. I dived below, and dragging with me Samuel Thomas, a gangway man and a fellow countryman, sprang into a room, shutting the door to keep out the heat that was already unbearable."

"The ship rocked and I expected every moment that it would sink. Outside I heard a voice pleading for the door to be opened. It was Scott, the first officer, and I opened the door and dragged him into the room."

"It soon became unbearably hot and I went on deck. All about were lying the dead and the dying. Little children were moaning for water. I did what I could for them. I obtained water, but they were unable to swallow, because of the ashes which clogged their throats. One little chap took water into his mouth and rinsed out the ashes, and his throat was burnt. He sank back unconscious and a few minutes later was dead."

"All aft the ship was afire, and from the land came draughts of terrible heat. Last when I could stand it no longer, I sprang overboard. The water was almost not enough to parboil me, but a wave soon swept in from the ocean, bringing with it cool water. I was caught in the receding wave, which was of tidal velocity, and was carried out to sea. Then, on the second return of the wave I was washed up against an overturned sloop to which I clung."

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FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE.

This is Her Seventy-Ninth Birthday.

London, May 15.-Congratulations poured in today upon Miss Florence Nightingale, the famous Crimean war nurse, the occasion being her seventy-ninth birthday.

There were a number of callers at her residence, all of whom were received and welcomed, although the health of the venerable lady has been very poor for several years.

The congratulations of the king and queen, in the form of autograph letters, were delivered to Miss Nightingale by a special messenger.

Despatches couched in felicitous phrases were received also from Miss Clara Barton, the czar of Russia and other notables.

It is known that for years Miss Nightingale has been an invalid as a result of her experiences in the Crimean war.

Although now confined to her bed a large part of the time, she always receives a welcome to any one who seeks advice on a question affecting the interests of the sick or the nurse who tends them.

She is always cheerful and spends most of her time in reading.

Must Show Tax Collectors. New York, May 15.-The tax commissioners, to-day, asked to hear those persons assessed for personal tax who plead non-residence.

The first case taken up was that of Mrs. Caroline Astor. She was assessed on \$250,000, but she objected that her legal residence was in Newport, R.I.

She obtained her certificate of residence there last January, and it is maintained by the commissioners that she is consequently not entitled to exemption from last October's assessment.

Many of New York's wealthiest residents are apparently endeavoring to avoid payment of personal taxes here by claiming to be residents of some other jurisdiction.

The commissioners, however, declare that they must show the best proof that their actual permanent homes are outside of New York and that their dwelling houses in this city are occupied only transiently.
