THE ANSWER GIVEN. The More This is Discussed the Better.

The question is asked why the Ontario government does not sell the pulp areas by auction. The answer is that the government has devised a wise method. Its policy in this respect cannot receive too much discussion and too close an examination by the public to suit Hon. G. W. Ross.

The policy of Mr. Ross has these advantages over the auction system: (1) it brings new pulp lands into existence on a spot, thus opening up the country; (2) it gives the public exchequer the benefit of increases in value; and (3) it leaves it in the power of government to see that no pulp mill shall hold more than a certain amount of land.

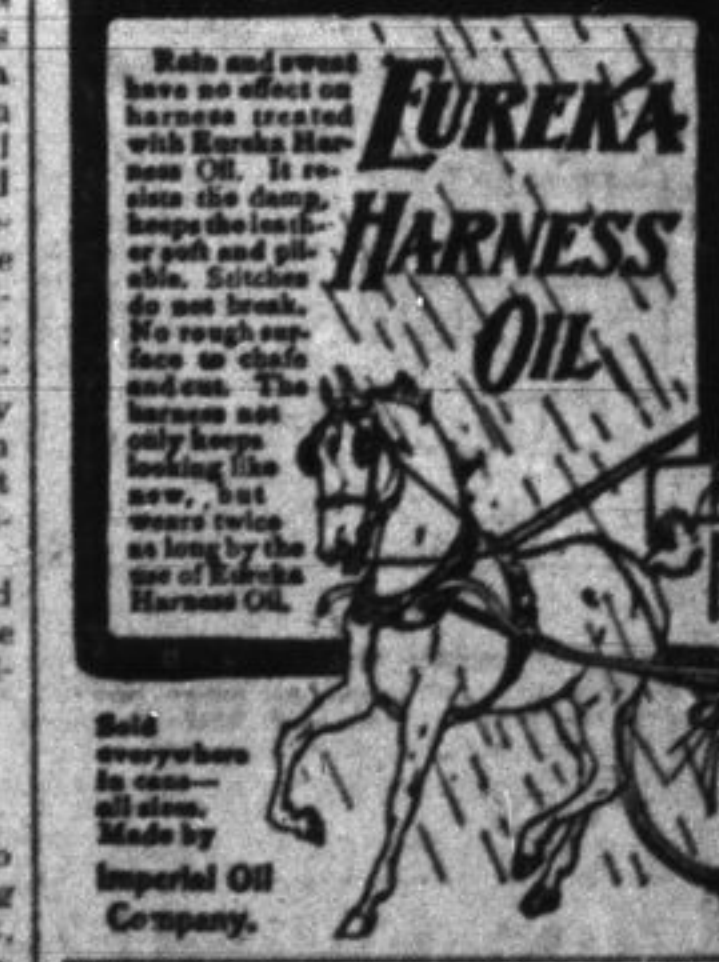
