The remains were forwarded to Truro, positively identified as those of Murray, and interred in the family plot in the Presbyterian cemetery.

Damage In The West.

Winnipeg, May 22.-Reports of damage by high winds, on Tuesday, continue to come in. Many barns and other buildings and a few houses were blown down and strawstacks, etc., scattered about. Around Carberry the damage seems to have been especially severe. The storm's path extended for about three miles, with a width of about 400 feet. The loss will be heavy.
